PURPOSE OF NAYDO NETWORKS



Everyone (across all positions) promotes philanthropy and can articulate the case for giving.


Financial Development is viewed and valued as a mission-aligned program of the organization and adequately resourced for success.

LEVELS ONE-THREE:


Each level adds practices as Ys works to sustain and deepen their culture of philanthropy.

STEPS IN THE GIFT CYCLE


- 1. Identification of Prospects
- 2. Cultivation and Involvement
- 3. Ask for Support
- 4. Acknowledgement/Stewardship
